The Louisa County Conservation Board met in regular session on Tuesday, August 9, 6:00 p.m. at the Columbus Community Center in Columbus Junction. Members present were: Jay Schweitzer, Brad Moss and Stan Staats. Others present: Julie Ohde and Jeff Snyder.

Moss moved to approve the agenda; Schweitzer seconded; motion passed.

Ohde reported on activities since the last meeting and discussion items for future meetings.

Schweitzer moved to approve the FY 2012 agreement with the State Historical Society of Iowa for management of Toolesboro Mounds & Museum; Moss Seconded; motion passed.

The board discussed management issues at River Forks Access.

Ohde updated the board on the status of the Eden property.

Ohde told the board that Cornerstone Excavating started working at the Louisa Interpretive Center site on August 8. She told the board that information from the schematic plans would be published in the October 2011 Naturally Louisa County newsletter. Moss offered to check with Monsanto on printing some large format pictures to be exhibited at the local libraries.

A committee is being set up to work on updating the interpretive center master plan. Representatives from the conservation board, Tri-Rivers and Board of Supervisors will be on the committee. Humphreys and Staats were appointed to serve.
