Cricket Camp

June 8-10, 9:00 -11:30 am
3-4 yrs old, \$30
Held at Chinkapin Bluffs

This camp is sure to get the attention of your pre-schooler by lots of hands-on fun exploring nature.

Polliwog Camp

June 20-24, 8:30 - 11:30 am
Entering K – 1st, \$35

Campers will explore the life of bugs, fish, frogs, birds and furry critters that live at Langwood.

Nature Detectives Camp

June 27-July 1, 8:30-noon
Entering 2nd – 3rd, \$40

Campers will learn about tracks and other animal signs through a variety of games and activities.

Fishing Camp

June 13-17, 8:30-noon
Entering 3rd – 5th, \$40

Campers can expect to fish every day. They will also learn to bait and rig their own pole, take fish off the line, identify fish and clean them. 15 participants total.

Jr. Naturalist Camp

August 4, 8:30 – 2:30 (canoeing)
Entering 4th – 6th, \$45

Campers will learn outdoor skills such as canoeing/kayaking, hiking, GPS and participate in an outdoor service learning project.

River Raiders Canoe Trek

Upper Iowa Canoe Trip
Entering 7th-8th, \$75

Explore the Upper Iowa River from Kendallville to Decorah. Campers will canoe, camp, cook outdoors as and learn other wilderness skills. The 2-night, 3-day trek will be spent paddling - winding around bends, through rapids and past scenic waterfalls, cold springs and 200-foot chimney bluffs. The trip includes the use of tents, food, canoes, lifejackets, paddles and other outdoor gear.
